Unit Reinstatement

If a Unit has gone inactive and wants to become active again, it must submit a Reinstatement Application. To reinstate the Unit, complete the Reinstatement Application and submit it, along with all required documents and dues, to the Lieutenant Commander responsible for the Division where the Unit is located.
